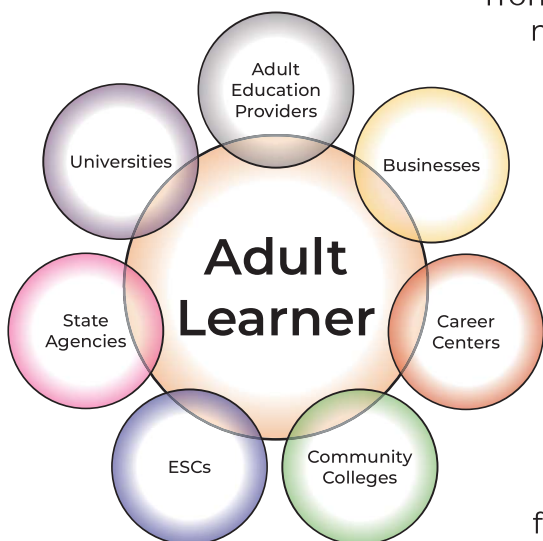


Announcing the Northeast Ohio Adult Education Providers Network

On November 17, 2023, adult education providers from more than 20 organizations met to establish the Northeast Ohio Adult Education Providers Network. Panelists Terry Echols (Cuyahoga County Public Library), Terrina Crow (Polaris Career Center), and John Martin (Seeds of Literacy) discussed the benefits of network membership and the value of a systemic approach to support the work of adult education. Participants shared their ideas for the Network's priorities, such as shared communications, collaboration, and professional development.

The Educational Service Center (ESC) of Northeast Ohio, in association with the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce, the Ohio Department of Higher Education, and the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation, identified and convened a broad spectrum of adult education providers across our region to explore and establish closer linkages across programs that serve adults engaged in adult education and workforce development.



Establishment of the Network results from a year of fact finding and meetings with myriad adult education providers in our region

who are engaging adults (14+ years) in acquiring those skills necessary for jobs and life success in programs that range from basic literacy and numeracy to GED, certificate programs, employment training, or to associate, bachelor, and advanced degrees.

Members of the NEO Adult Education Providers Network meet to collaborate around topics of communication, marketing, and sharing promising practices to move toward providing a continuum of education-to-workforce opportunities for adults. Our goal is to move from a collection of independent programs for adult learners to a regional systemic approach that is collaborative and transparent. It is anticipated that such an adult education-to-workforce system, providing for educational and

training opportunities at multiple entry levels, will offer a more clear, concise and easily navigable system for adult learners.
