What if you could help solve the most challenging issues facing students?

The First Ring Student Leadership Institute (FRSLI) empowers high school students like you to recognize the issues impacting their lives, give voice to their unique perspectives about those issues and take an active role in solving them. Past participants have helped increased access to mental healthcare in their schools. implemented programs to improve school culture and shared student-centered solutions for absenteeism with state leaders

FRSLI is built on a social justice framework called Youth Participatory Action Research (YPAR) that recognizes students as experts in their own experiences and emphasizes student-adult collaboration to make change. Entering the program as sophomores, students work in school teams to identify an important issue in their school, research the nature and scope of the problem. and at the final meeting pitch their recommended solutions to principals and superintendents. As juniors and seniors, students can return for a second and third year in the program to work collectively on a state-level issue in education while helping lead the program.

Participants attend 8 all-day sessions during the school year where they share their ideas, engage in hands-on activities and collaborate with students from other districts.

Youth Participatory Action Research (YPAR) is a social justice framework that empowers young people by recognizing them as experts of their own life experiences. Students investigate an issue they feel passionate about and collaborate with adult decision-makers to transform their environments.

YPAR builds students' leadership and social emotional skills through culturally relevant projectbased deep learning. At the end of the program participants have the knowledge, leadership skills and sense of agency to solve critical issues within their schools and communities.
