Connecting Concerns to Performance Evaluations & Improvement Plans for Administrative Positions

It is often difficult to merge concerns about an employee's work with an eventual performance evaluation and possible improvement plan. This is generally because concerns with work performance are not addressed in a timely manner. Many employers hope that their concerns will fade away after experience and time influence the employee's work product and/or productivity. In many cases, these concerns become ongoing, underlying issues that are a constant source of discomfort and

negativity. If not addressed appropriately, and in a timely manner, the deadline for termination may be missed, and the opportunity to hire a more suitable employee disappears. Learning how to write a clear and concise Concern/Suggestion letter is key to alerting the employee that there are serious issues with their work.

This training will assist building-level teams with establishing a Tier II system of intervention which includes reviewing recommended team membership, team operating procedures, screening, and data decision rules for appropriately identifying which students would benefit from Tier II Intervention and understanding function-based thinking for behavioral supports.


