

OHIO'S HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Class of 2023 and beyond



Students must earn 21 credits in specified subjects and take the required tests. Students will then decide how they will round out their diploma requirements.

English	4 credits
Math	4 credits
Science 1 life science, 1 physical science, & 1 advanced science	3 credits
Social Studies ½ Government, ½ US History, ½ World History	4 credits
Health including CPR	.50 credit
Phys. Ed. or completion of PE waiver	.50 credit
Electives must include financial literacy (Class of 2026 and beyond)	5 credits

• Students must complete 1 fine arts/performing arts credit OR complete a program through Polaris Career Center

• In addition to the credits above, college bound students should complete a minimum of two World Language credits



OR

Students need to earn a competency score of 684 or higher on Ohio's high school Integrated Math 1 and English Language Arts 2 tests. Students who do not pass a test will be offered additional support and must retake the test at least once.

OR

<u>Option 1</u>

Career Readiness

Demonstrate two career-focused activities. More information can be found <u>here</u>.

Option 2

Enlist in the Military

Show evidence of enlistment to school counselor.

Option 3

Complete College Coursework

Earn college credits in a nonremedial Math or English course (for the subject area not passed) to demonstrate competency.

3. SHOW READINESS

Students must demonstrate readiness by earning at least two diploma seals, one of which must be state defined. These seals give students the chance to demonstrate academic, technical and professional skills and knowledge that align to their passions, interests and plans after high school.
